Children will follow the Ragers' model of making friends with their neighbors through the distribution of cookies. This project may be done by individual families in their neighborhoods or by children's classes in the church neighborhood. Children must be accompanied by an adult when going door-to-door.

Cookies may be homemade or bought. Package them for distribution in decorative bags or boxes. Children will have more fun and take more ownership of the project if allowed to help with baking and packaging the cookies.

Children and adults may want to make the trek about simply making introductions or about making introductions and inviting the neighbors to church or a specific event at your church. If you are inviting people to your church or to a church event, be sure to include printed information.

Before going out, circle up and pray, asking God to open the hearts of people and to direct you to them. Write down the names and addresses of people you meet along the way for reference and use in future outreaches. Don't forget to also engage people you may meet in passing on streets and sidewalks.

As you connect with people, ask if you can pray for them. If they have a prayer request, pray with them immediately. You will be surprised at how many people (even unbelievers) will accept prayer when offered, and it is important they hear you pray for them. They will remember you later.

After the cookies have all been distributed, end in prayer for the people you have touched, praying for more encounters with them. Use your list to pray for them by name.
