Children's Missions Projects

Local: Messages of Hope

One way to be salt and light in your community is to share encouraging messages and Scripture passages in places where people may be under stress, such as in hospital, doctor or dentist waiting areas. Help the children create Messages of Hope.

Cut pieces of heavy, colorful cardstock into thirds. Each piece will measure about 8.5x3.5 inches. Have the children write short passages of Scripture or messages of hope on each piece and decorate with stickers, markers, etc. Some examples of Scripture passages include: Proverbs 3:5-6, John 3:16, 1 Peter 5:7, Isaiah 40:29, Psalm 145:13 and Psalm 56:3.

With permission, leave a stack in hospital waiting areas or doctor or dentist offices with instructions to "Take One." Or you may prefer to gain permission for the children to hand deliver the messages directly to patients in a hospital, especially the children's wing. If hand delivering the messages, offer to pray with the patients as well.

Afterward, commend the children for being salt and light in their community.
