Church planters in Seattle work to gain visibility in the city. One way they do this is by participating in community events. Since Seattleites love the great outdoors and are very health conscious, numerous running, cycling and swimming events are scheduled every year, many as fundraisers to benefit worthy causes, such as cures for cancer or Alzheimer's disease.

These types of events are common in communities all over North America. An event in your community would be a great place for your children to minister by way of water or snack distribution. Or your children may even want to participate in the event as runners or walkers. Your church can gain visibility at the event by wearing T-shirts that identify them as members of your church.

Have information on your church available for distribution. Be sure to note any special events such as VBS, kids' camps or revivals. Engage event attenders in casual conversation, being prepared to pray for them or share the gospel, if they desire.

Alternately, you may wish to sponsor an event of your own. Consider partnering with other churches in your Baptist association to cover as much of the community as possible.
